This online Christian communications course is essential for Christian leaders to gain practical strategies that emphasize active listening, empathy, and emotional intelligence rooted in biblical wisdom. This course empowers leaders to approach all conversations with integrity and humility, thereby fostering unity and growth within their communities while faithfully adhering to Scriptural teachings.

The course objective is to furnish students with essential tools and insights to adeptly handle challenging dialogues while upholding biblical virtues of love, humility, and wisdom. Adopting a semi-formal methodology, these sessions aim to elucidate the pivotal role of communication in nurturing robust relationships and resolving conflicts within church and marketplace settings.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- To equip students with the fundamental understanding and practical application methods of biblical principles that direct productive communication and conflict resolution.
- To expose students to the principles and theories of effective communication in the ministry and the marketplace.
- To introduce students to the biblical nature of conflict sources and resolutions.
- To familiarize students with common methods of conflict management, and effective strategies to manage conflict acceptably and productively.
- To examine various communication models and the role of self-concept in communication.
- To gain an understanding of nonverbal messages and the role of stress in conflict management.

SPECIFIC LEARNING OUTCOME OBJECTIVES:

- Develop comfortable and effective engagement in crucial conversations, utilizing biblical principles for graceful navigation of sensitive topics, fostering comprehension and retention.
- Learn practical conflict resolution strategies and apply biblical teachings to personal and professional relationships.
- Cultivate an understanding of others' perspectives through experiential exercises,
 leading to productive communication of biblical principles.
- Understand and manage personal emotions for constructive conversations, demonstrating ongoing development of purposeful responses.
- Explore ethical dilemmas with confidence and wisdom, guided by biblical principles and inspired by the Holy Spirit for practical application.

COURSE FORMAT AND PROCEDURES

- 8 Weeks Weekly Lesson Lectures: lecture, weekly reading assignment, PowerPoint slides, topical resources,including video clips.
- Weeks 9 -10: Crucial Conversation Student Presentations- Prep, Process, and Present – Students will identify the principal and or skill learned to write up their (a) final assignment and (b) share their story in a video format.

 Weeks 9 -10 Group Forum: This is a virtual format for individual presentations to be presented live in class. Each student will offer feedback on the other students' presentation in the online forum. The instructor will communicate details and guidelines for giving feedback. This presentation will be 20% of the student's total grade.

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

15% of Grade: Quiz Scores

Each week includes a multiple-choice quiz worth 12 points per quiz to measure curriculum understanding.

120 total points are possible.

15 % of Grade: Class Attendance

Advance preparation, and thoughtful participation - Students are expected to attend promptly online weekly.

Advance preparation for class discussion is expected. Thoughtful participation in class discussions and case studies is required.

Each week's discussion is worth 12 possible points. 120 total points are possible.

50% of Grade: Weekly Practical Application Worksheet Writing Assignments

Assignments will be based on assigned reading, writing, and collaborative learning. Total writing for course - 10-14 double-spaced pages, 5-10 references, and in-text citations.

Each writing assignment is worth 40 points, with 400 total points possible.

20% of Grade: Final Presentation Project

The final project centers on students' research and the construction of a written presentation outlining a Crucial Conversation they experienced, how they handled it, and what the outcome was, using the skills and the tools they have learned. Additionally, each student will create an individual video recording, accounting for 20% of total final project points, wherein students present the scenario, identify a relevant skill, and demonstrate its application for more effective communication. This final writing assignment should include a minimum of how many pages, with five sourced citations and references per APA format.

Total points of 160 are possible.

Percentage of grade points possible totals 100%.
